As you may know, our district participates in the Oregon Battle of the Books (OBOB), which is a voluntary reading motivation and comprehension competition program sponsored by the Oregon Association of School Libraries in conjunction with a Library Services and Technology Act grant. Students in 3rd-12th grade, regardless of ability, are exposed to quality literature representing a variety of literary styles and viewpoints. As a reminder, our students and their parents have a choice whether or not to participate in OBOB; none of our teachers, nor our curriculum, require OBOB participation.
